Raising a Modern-Day Knight

Every man wants to succeed with his son. Deep down, we all dream of releasing into the world a son whose life is highly competent, whose character is rock solid, and whose aspirations are noble. The process behind launching a son like that can be as mysterious as it is intimidating...but no process is more important or personally fulfilling. How do we do this though?

Raising a Modern Day Knight (RMDK) is a short-term small group program that guides and equips fathers. This six-week DVD series will give you a clear vision and practical how to's in the powerful role fathers have with their son(s). Every dad wants to show his son the way ... to life, to God, to authentic masculinity. And every son wants to connect with his dad's heart, hear his praise, and build lifelong memories.

The Raising a Modern-Day Knight series is for fathers to go through with other fathers. It is not recommended that fathers and sons go through this together. Each week RMDK has created a "Dad Challenge" that fathers and sons do together. These fun activities are great connecting points between father and son and can build an incredible bond to last a lifetime.

There will be a meeting Wednesday, January 25, at 7:00 p.m. for those who would like more information about the series. RMDK is for dads with sons who are 5-6 years old up through 14-15 years of age. We plan to meet February 8, 15, & 22, and March 7, 14, & 21, starting at 6:30 p.m.
